The regular meeting of the Historic Preservation Commission was called to order by Chairman James Hartshorne at 5:00 p.m. at 118 W. Cook Avenue.

- a) **715 N. Milwaukee Avenue (Libertyville Town Hall).** Review National Register Nomination.

Mr. Christopher Sandine, Associate Planner, stated the Commission has been requested to provide comment on the National Register Nomination for the Libertyville Town Hall. Mr. Sandine stated the Commission has an opportunity to participate in this request as a Certified Local Government.

Ms. Jenny Barry, graduate student at Loyola University-Chicago, stated she is participating in a historic preservation class where the final project is to prepare a National Register Nomination. Ms. Barry stated they chose the Libertyville Town Hall or the American Legion Town Hall (current) because it is one of the most historically significant buildings in the Village of Libertyville. Ms. Barry stated the proposed nomination has been worked on with the State Historic Preservation Office and it includes their requirements. Ms. Barry stated the Commission has an opportunity to review the proposal, along with the Mayor of Libertyville. Ms. Barry stated the proposal will appear before the Advisory Council for the State of Illinois on June 24, 2022, where a recommendation will be provided for approval or denial. Ms. Barry stated they did work on this proposal with representatives of the American Legion, so they know this project is underway.
