

The Village of Libertyville is currently extending the Municipal Aggregation program with the mc² through August of 2027. mc² is sending letters to residents informing them of the program on June 17th, and as such, the Village may receive some phone calls. Here are some frequently asked questions the staff may receive:

Q: How does this municipal aggregation program affect resident's rate?

It does not. mc² guarantees that they will match the ComEd rate from month to month. Therefore there is no change to the resident's rate.

Q: What is the benefit of this program?

The Village is supporting green energy, at no cost to the residents or Village. Libertyville will become an EPA (Environmental Protection Agency) Green Powered Community and created over 6,000,000 kilowatts in sustainable energy.

Q: What is municipal aggregation?

A: Municipal aggregation is a program where your town negotiates on behalf of its residents and small businesses to secure lower electricity rates from suppliers.

Q: Do I have to participate in the municipal aggregation program?

A: No, participation is voluntary. However, the program is designed to provide renewable energy, so it may be beneficial for many residents and businesses to join.

Q: Will I still receive the same quality of electricity if I participate?

A: Yes, the reliability and quality of your electricity service will remain the same.

Q: Can I opt out of the municipal aggregation program if I don't want to participate?

A: Yes, you have the option to opt out of the program without any penalties or fees. You will continue to receive electricity from the utility at the default rate. If you'd like to opt out, please give me your name, address, and ComEd number, and we will ensure that you are opted out. Please send that information to Adam Hoover at ahover@nimec.net to ensure an opt out.

Q: What happens if I move out of the town?

A: If you move out of the town, you will no longer be eligible to participate in the municipal aggregation program. Your new location will have its own electricity options and rates.
